
RE: Comments to the Proposed Rules Regarding the Javits-Wagner-O'Day Program,

Dear Mr. Heyer,

This letter is sent in opposition of the above referenced proposal. As a producing JWOD agency, we have 33 people with disabilities working two contracts.

I would much rather see the President's Committee develop a more competitive stance to fight off threats that may take jobs away from people with disabilities. To that end, I believe you are missing the point. Non profits do not deserve nor require more governance under the JWOD Act for the sake of a few "bad apples". At a time when social services programs are being cut or shrunk, more is expected of the non profit sector. It seems to me that your focus should be on the vast majority of us that serve the vast majority of people with disabilities, not punishing us with unreasonable regulations. The regulations you are advocating are already the responsibility of other bodies.
